#### Aim and Methods

- The aim is to determine to what extent sustainability of gardening is published in the Czech Republic, what rules gardeners observe in their activities and whether these two perceptions of experts and practicioners overlap.
- Methods Data triangulation
  - Content analysis of magazine "Zahrádkář" (Gardener)
  - Secondary data analysis from Public opinion research
  - Semi-structured interviews with community gardeners

  - Environmentally friendly
  - Socially acceptable

 The editorial board consists of experts with PhD. degrees






## The Experts' View – Content Analysis of "Gardener"

Composting	13
Animals Beneficial in the Garden	6


#### The Gardeners' Activities – Public Opinion Research

- Population of the Czech Republic 10,5 mil.
- 43 % operate their own garden, field, or orchard
  - 73 % of them are from the urban area
  - They evaluate their living standard as "rather good" or "not good, not bad".
- Reasons for gardening:
  - it is a hobby
  - to produce fresh and healthy food

#### The Community Garden Experience

- Gardening as a hobby, importance to children
- Production does not provide all necessary food for consumption
- Building social relations
- Not using industrial fertilizers
- Composting and rain water collecting
